

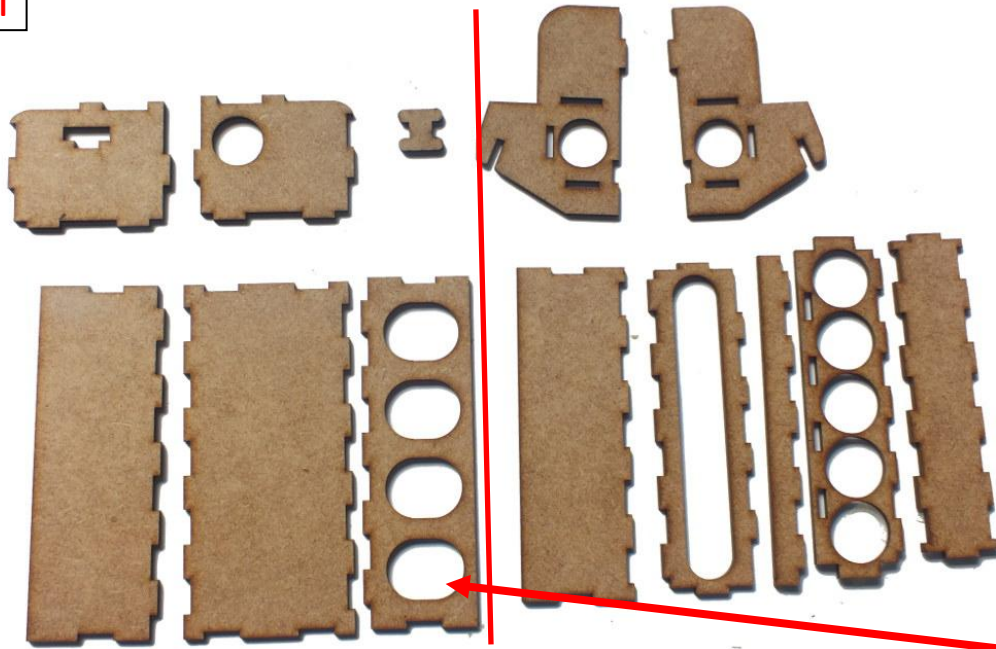
# Small Dropper drawers

**READ General Instructions FIRST!**

**TIP:** Most pieces fit together without glue. Do a test run first, before gluing.

**Sheets:  
two times DDS1**

1



1 the pieces to be glued.

**Upper and lower drawers.**

The lower drawer has the slightly longer pieces, in the picture on the left side.

**If you want to store paints in the drawers, cut out the holes in the front first.**

**For tools, leave them closed, so things can't fall out.**

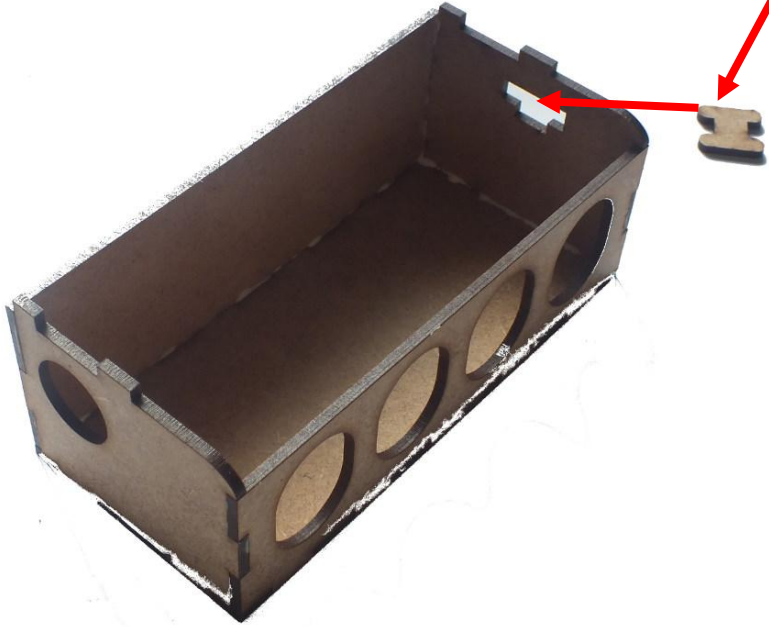

The “Bones” are to connect units to each other. No glue.

**2 lower drawer:**

Glue together from bottom, 2 sides, back and front walls.

There are left and right side drawers. Ensure that the round finger holes are on one drawer facing left, and on the other one facing right.

### 3 upper drawer:

first glue on the front wall  
(with elongated slit into the  
slits of the paint holder).

4 then glue on the bottom plate to the front wall.

Ensure right angles.

5 glue on the side pieces.

They only fit in one way.

On each side, one tab sticks out.  
This is correct.

6 Glue on the back wall and the narrow strip at the bottom of the back.

Tip: Insert upper drawer into the lower one during glue drying time so that everything fits together. They are fitting snugly.

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This is not a toy. Recommended for ages 14 & up
